These guns were made by Argentina with plans, drawings & directions from Colt., The left side of the slide is marked FABRICA MILITAR DE ARMAS PORTATILES-ROSARIO SISTEMA COLT CAL. 11.25 mm INDUSTRIA ARGENTINA. The right side is marked P.N.M. with a crest. The frame has several proof marks just above the trigger guard. The serial number is on the frame, slide, and chamber. The chamber is also marked 45 Auto. The bore is shiny and the grooves appear to be deep. The gun is in overall good condition with signs of regular use.

#### 54 Lot 54: WWII CZ VZ. 38 .380 Auto Includes Extra Mag and Holster - Very Good Condition

WWII but was received by the WWII CZECH CZ VZ 38 PISTOL .380 ACP | WWII era Czechoslovakian CZ vz. 38 .380 ACP pistol. Marked "E7 39" on the right side of the frame, and "CESKA ZBROJOVKA AKC SPOL V PRAZE" on the left side of the frame. Slide and frame matching numbered. Includes Holster 7 2 Mags., The CZ vz.38 pistol was developed by the CZ factory as a replacement for Czechoslovakia's vz.24 pistols. It was formally accepted by the Czech Army in June of 1938, and 41,000 were ordered from the factory. Tooling and production setup took close to a year, and the German military occupied the country just 4 days after testing of the first preproduction batch of pistols. However, the German authorities decided that CZ should complete to pistol production anyway, and took possession of the guns themselves for use by the Wehrmacht, Reich Labor Service, Luftwaffe, and other services at the Pistole 39(t)., The initial order of 41,000 was completed by the end of 1939 with serial numbers from 250,000 through 291,000 and accepted by the Czech military on behalf of the Germans – so these pistols will not have waffenamt marks. Two additional batches were made – 3000 guns for the Luftwaffe (numbered 240,000-242,000) and 1000 for export, probably to Bulgarian (with B-prefix serial numbers 291,000-292,000)., Mechanically, the vz.38 is a simple blowback automatic pistol chambered for the .380 cartridge, aka 9mm Browning or 9x17mm. It is a rather awkward looking gun, and a double action only trigger. It does have a quite unique and very simple disassembly procedure though!

# 55 Lot 55: Winchester Model 1895 (Take-Down) .303 British Lever Action

It has the standard Winchester markings, a pinned high blade front sight and adjustable notch rear sight, and standard smooth walnut stock and forearm with ebony tip insert. The majority of the Model 1895s produced were the 7.62x54r Russian muskets. The .303 British caliber was added to the Model 1895 line in 1898 and is rare compared to the more common Russian and American calibers.

#### 56 Lot 56: Winchester Model 53 25-20 WCF Lever Action (Early 1929)

The Winchester model 53 was made from 1924-1931 and according to Winchester, approximately 15,100 were produced. It was designed to be an updated version of the Model 1892. This very nice version was made in 1929 according to the serial number and is chambered in 25-20 WCF. It has all the correct markings on the barrel and receiver.

The 32 Automatic is a S& W collector's prize, due particularly to the quite limited production total of but 957., This Smith & Wesson 32 Automatic is in near-mint condition with all the bluing intact. It does show a few minor scuffs and signs of wear but they are very minimal and not noticeable.

Known to many as the "Safety Hammerless" (among other nicknames), the 32 Safety First Model was unusual in three major respects: The hammer was concealed, and thus the revolver could only be fired double action, and a safety bar set onto the backstrap had to be simultaneously squeezed to allow for firing.
